WSHH is an Educational and Recreational Youth Center that serves 1st-5th grade students who are from low-income families in the West Side of Corpus Christi. The Center provides academic enhancement, character formation, career opportunities, extra-curricular activities, and organized sports.

Our Vision

West Side Helping Hand's future will continue to advance new ideas and services that profoundly improve life for the youth on the West Side of Corpus Christi.

We envision a community where at-risk children are hopeful and excited about their futures, and confident and capable of realizing their full potential in school and later in life. They build healthy and respectful interpersonal relationships with family and friends.

Our Future

As West Side Helping Hand continues to grow as a service to Corpus Christi's youth and families, the Benefactors, Board of Directors and staff believe the time is right to develop and share a forward-looking vision with the community at large. WSHH's vision is rooted in practical, real-life wants and needs. It reflects high ideal of love and hope – the hope for a highly desirable future for our youth that will bring out the best in themselves, their families and our community.

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Program Overview:

Academics: Students arrive from their respective schools and immediately sit down in the West Side Helping Hand center to do their daily homework with the help of a West Side Helping Hand staff member or volunteer. Report cards are collected each month. The grades of each student are traced through a computer database program. Many of our students at West Side Helping Hand show improvement in their academics.

<u>Character Formation:</u> Each day, West Side Helping Hand students receive a character formation talk from a staff member at West Side Helping Hand. The short talks cover basic character formation topics such as personal discipline, having a positive outlook on life, getting ahead in life, forming a strong will, setting firm goals to live an extraordinary life.

<u>Organized Sports:</u> In a world where many children are home alone doing nothing or absorbed in mindless gadgets, the sports program of West Side Helping Hand is a vital part of what we do. Sports are important for childhood development, forming life-long friendships, and just having good fun. At West Side Helping Hand we focus on soccer, basketball, four-square, Ga-ga, an awesome playground and other games for kids.

Extracurricular Activities: West Side Helping Hand students are excited to participate in our extracurricular activities. We have partnered with Tennis Success, Grow Local South Texas, and Team Nutrition USDA from Texas A&M. These programs encourage students on staying physically active while promoting healthy eating habits.

Program Schedule

Our program operates Monday Through Friday 3:00PM-6:00PM. West Side Helping Hand follows the CCISD School Calendar. Each day includes structured time for homework completion, engaging enrichment activities, and recreational play.

Registration Process

To enroll your child, please complete the registration form and submit it to the Program Director at West Side Helping Hand or your school Principal. All forms of the application must be completed. There is no fee for registration or to participate in our program.

Health and Safety:

The health and safety of our students are of the utmost importance to us. We ensure first aid supplies are stocked and replenished if needed in case of emergencies and each of our staff members are CPR/First Aid certified. Keeping the environment free from clutter and the playground area safe for the children at all times is a priority. We make sure to sanitize surfaces, utensils, and encourage hand washing throughout the day. Supervising children at all times is our top priority to prevent any accidents.

COVID-19 Safety Measures

In response to COVID-19, we have implemented strict safety measures. Which will be listed below. Please ensure your child follows health guidelines and inform us of any health conditions or medications. These recommendations are provided to you though the Texas Department of Health and Human Services. Follow Health Recommendations for Day Youth Camp Families.

Parents, Guardians, and Relatives of participants are NOT allowed to enter the facility at West Side Helping Hand to drop off or pick up a participant. This safety measure is to ensure the safety of your child. All participants must be dropped off outside of our front doors and undergo a mandatory health screening prior to entering camp each day. All staff, volunteers, and visitors that enter the camp must undergo the mandatory health screening each time they enter the facility. Parents are allowed to drop off students and pick up students from our facility. Transportation to our facility is provided by our staff during the program year. The students are picked up at their schools in our vans by our WSHH staff. During the Summer Program the children are dropped off and picked up by their parents.

Cleaning/Sanitization Policies and Procedures

All participants will be encouraged but not required to wear protective face coverings when indoors or in proximity with students. Protective face coverings will be made available to all staff, volunteers, and participants daily if requested. Participants will not be allowed to interact with participants from another group in order to limit cross-contamination. Bathrooms and lavatories are inspected, disinfected, and sanitized by staff members on an hourly basis or after being used. Disposable cups, plates, and utensils will be used for each meal. Sanitizing stations will be set up throughout the facility for staff, volunteers, and participants to regularly use.

Behavior, Discipline, and Expectations

We encourage positive behavior through clear expectations and reinforcement. However, if behavioral issues arise, we have a progressive disciplinary approach that aims to address concerns while maintaining a respectful environment. Three (3) reoccurring issues the student will remove themselves from the program. A conference with the parent will be initiated in the event of a second occurrence of disciplinary.

Communication

Open communication is key to your child's success. We encourage parents to reach out to Coaches with any questions or concerns. Regular updates and important notifications will be shared through Communication Channels, for example text, email, phone calls etc. Report cards are required to be handed in to our Director of Administration every 6 weeks.

Pick-up and Drop-off

Summer Program- please adhere to our arrival and pick time. Ensure your child is on time and let us know in advance if there will be any changes in pick-up arrangements. Three (3) late pick-ups may result in removal of the program. The Summer Program runs for 6 weeks from June to July. Arrival is at 8AM and pick up time is 5PM. The authorized Pick-up list must be updated in order to release your child to your listed individuals. This is for the safety of your children. Children will not be released to anyone not authorized on your pick-up list unless a phone call or written notice has been given to staff personnel.

Emergency Procedures

Your child's safety is very important to us. In case of emergencies, we have established protocols for evacuation and contacting emergency contacts. Please provide accurate and up-to-date contact information so in the event of an emergency we are able to contact you.

Enrollment Information

Our program is open to children in [Age Range of 5 years old to age 13] Enrollments are processed on a first-come, first-served basis, with details available in our enrollment forms.

Waitlist Policy

Provide your required information to be placed on the wait list: Parent's name and contact information. Child's name, school attending, age and grade. If there are any changes to your contact information, please contact the WSHH to update your file. There is no specified length of time that you need to be on the list to be offered a spot. It is based on first come first serve bases. As availability opens the next child on the list will be placed in the program.

Special Events and Field Trips

Teach, model, and review appropriate behavior with your child for at least a week before the big special event or Field Trip. Inappropriate behavior will result in non-participation in any future field trips or special events. Field trips and Special Events require as many adult eyes and ears as possible. The children will be excited and antsy, ready to go. If you volunteer to be a chaperone for any field trip or special event, please be aware we have limited space and any fees associated with an event or field trip will be your responsibility. Keeping track of each and every child is our number one priority therefore your participation in any special event or field trip will require all volunteers to help staff with multiple head counts several times throughout the entire event or trip. With proper planning and a positive attitude, field trips and special events can be unique ways to explore the outside world with your students.

Snack and Meal Information

The afterschool snack component fills the afternoon hunger gap for school children. WSHH provides a healthy meal and snack for the students if they choose to eat. After-school snacks give students a **nutritional boost** and at WSHH we include this along with supervised activities that are safe, fun and filled with learning opportunities.
